<u>Dr. Joseph Romm</u> is the editor of Climate Progress and a Senior Fellow at the Center for American Progress. In 2009, <u>Time</u> magazine named him one of the "Heroes of the Environment" and "The Web's most influential climate-change blogger."

Romm was Acting Assistant Secretary of Energy for Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy during the Clinton Administration where he directed \$1 billion in research, development, demonstration, and deployment of clean energy and carbonmitigating technology. He holds a Ph.D. in physics from MIT. In

2008, Romm was <u>elected</u> a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science for "distinguished service toward a sustainable energy future and for persuasive discourse on why citizens, corporations, and governments should adopt sustainable technologies."

In 2007, <u>TIME</u> named Climate Progress one of the "Top 15 Green Websites," writing that "Romm occupies the intersection of climate science, economics and policy.... On his blog and in his most recent book, *Hell and High Water*, you can find some of the most cogent, memorable, and deployable arguments for immediate and overwhelming action to confront global warming." In 2009, <u>Rolling Stone</u> named Romm #88 on its list of The 100 "people who are reinventing America" calling him "America's fiercest climatechange activist-blogger."

In March 2009, The <u>New York Times</u> 'Tom Friedman wrote that Romm is "a physicist and climate expert who writes the indispensable blog climateprogress.org." In April, <u>U.S. News & World Report</u> named Romm one of the 8 "most influential energy and environmental policymakers in the Obama era," writing, "In terms of his cachet in the blogosphere, Joe Romm is something like the climate change equivalent of economist (and New York Times columnist) Paul Krugman."
