


U.S. House of Representatives


Democrats gained 22 seats in the 2008 election; 5 races are undecided






U.S. Senate

House Energy and Commerce Committee

- Committee change not directly made by the voters on November 4, but resulting from subsequent action by House Democrats:
 - Rep. Henry Waxman (CA) will replace Rep. John
 Dingell (MI) as chairman
 - Likely to mean greater attention to climate change, clean air protection, fuel efficiency, and energy conservation measures

Likely Priorities in the 111th Congress

- Water infrastructure "2-step"
 - Investments to support economic stimulus for Obama's number 1 priority: economic recovery
 - Program changes some time later
- Climate change, climate change, climate change
- Everything else

What is Everything Else?

- A long list of issues and items overdue for legislative attention, or recommendations for action from interest groups
 - There is no shortage of policy recommendations from think tanks, academics, interest groups for the Obama Administration and Congress
- Obama campaign environmental policy priorities emphasized climate change

What is Everything Else? (cont.)

- Some likely legislative priorities:
 - Clean Water Act jurisdiction (what is meant by "navigable waters") in response to SWANCC, Rapanos Supreme Court rulings
 - Great Lakes restoration, protection
 - Water Resources Development Act
 - Reinvigorating resources of federal agencies
